How to apply

Apply online for all SDU programmes. You will find details on how to apply and the deadlines you need to meet on our website. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you need assistance in your application process.

For the Bachelor's intake applications to SDU have to be sent online via the national application system optagelse.dk. The system opens on February 1st. You have to upload all relevant documents to your application on optagelse.dk.

To apply for a Master's programme at SDU, you have to submit an application via the online application portal DANS. See dans.stads.dk. Before you can create your application, you have to set up a user profile in the application system. When you set up a user, you have to upload a copy of your passport or another ID including picture, name, date of birth and nationality. If you live in Denmark, you can also login with the Danish NemID. If you have a login from another Danish educational institution, you can also use this to access the application system.

You can apply for up to three programmes at the University of Southern Denmark. You simply have to submit an application for each programme. Once you have submitted more than one application, you will be asked to prioritize the programmes you have applied for.

English language

If you apply for a Master's or Bachelor's programme taught in English, you must prove your English proficiency. Your English proficiency is important, so that you can get the most out of your education.



requirements

Language tests

We accept the following English language tests:

- TOEFL IBT test with a minimum score of 88 (maximum two years old)
- IELTS academic test with a minimum overall band score of 6.5 (maximum two years old)
- · C1 Advanced (CAE) with a minimum result of C
- C2 Proficiency (CPE)

Both CAE and CPE must be from a Cambridge Network or from University of Michigan.

EU citizens

If you are an EU/EEA, Nordic, or Swiss citizen, you may be able to prove your English skills by way of your secondary school diploma. You must prove an upper intermediate level in English comparable to the Danish "English B" level with a grade equivalent to 3.0 or higher in the Danish grading scale (2 is passed, 12 is max). To do so, you need to document the number of English lessons per week, number of weeks per school year, and the number of years you have attended high school. You must submit a stamped and signed SDU Statement of Hours.

Deadlines

Documentation concerning your English language skills must be sent to SDU before:

- · July 5th if you apply for a Bachelor's
- · May 15th if you apply for a Master's starting in September
- December 1st if you apply for a Master's starting in February

Tuition Fees

If you are an EU citizen, you do not have to pay any tuition fees at SDU.

Tuition fees at SDU →

Non-EU/EEA citizens are required to pay tuition.

The tuition fees differ from programme to programme. Check sdu.dk about the prices.

No fees for EU students

Are you a full degree student and come from the Nordic countries, EU/EEA countries or Switzerland?

—If "yes", you can study for free at SDU. We do not charge tuition fees for full degree students from the Nordic countries, the EU/EEA countries or Switzerland.

Scholarships for Engineers

75 scholarships are awarded to non-EU/EEA students doing their Master's in one of our engineering programmes on our campus in Sønderborg.



SDU will assist you in finding a place to live

We recommend that you apply for accommodation as soon as you have submitted your application to SDU even if you are not sure you will be admitted. Please note that SDU offers programmes in several cities and it is important that you apply for accommodation in all the cities where the programmes you have applied for admission to are offered.

To be guaranteed accommodation you must apply before the deadline:

September admission: May 1
February admission: November 1

In that case, we will assist you in finding a place to live. There are several accommodation options offered through our housing office:

- Rooms in a campus hall (Kollegium), price: 260-400 euro per month.
- Private rooms in a house or a flat, price:
 250-500 euro per month.
- Private flats either alone or shared with other students, prices vary considerably




SDU is a modern institution offering education and research at the highest level

The rules

If you are a Nordic, EU/EEA or Swiss citizen, there are no restrictions to the number of hours you can work in Denmark. As a non-EU/EAA student you can work for up to 20 hours a week while you study in Denmark.

If you work more than this, your residence permit will be revoked. A general idea of a minimum expected wage is about 100 DKK (13.50 €) per hour. You should get a contract.

There are numerous reasons to work in Denmark. Foreign national workers routinely names these benefits:

- Denmark rank top in the world in work-life balance surveys.
- A welfare state: tax pays for child care, education, access to doctors and hospitals, elderly care, etc.
- A high quality of life: foreign national workers express a high level of satisfaction with leisure and cultural opportunities in Denmark.
- Danish business culture: a flat management structure and open dialogue between management and employees is typical in the workplace. Most workplaces regularly offers continuing education to their employees.
