A brilliant place to be

Portsmouth is located on England's south coast, which offers some of the best weather in the UK. In our vibrant and cosmopolitan city, the historic sits alongside the modern. Portsmouth is small enough to feel at home in and you can get around quickly and easily. Most University buildings are right in the heart of the city and everything you need – entertainment, shopping, the seafront – is within easy reach.

Well connected

Southsea seafront is a short walk from the city centre and main University campus. Here you can enjoy fantastic sea views, four miles of beach and the green spaces of Southsea Common, ideal for meeting friends and having summer picnics. The Common also hosts live music, running events and even a kite festival. If you want to see more of the UK, you will find good road and rail links to other major cities. London is just a 90 minute direct train journey away. Heathrow, Gatwick and Southampton airports are within easy reach. If you want to get to Europe, there are regular ferries to France and Spain.

Home to the Royal Navy, Portsmouth is a proud maritime city. Portsmouth Historic Dockyard hosts HMS Victory and the award-winning Mary Rose Museum among other famous attractions. You can also visit Southsea Castle, where Henry VIII stood and watched the Mary Rose sink in 1545.
- 2 The Hotwalls Studios and Old Portsmouth**
Part of Old Portsmouth's historic Hotwalls area hosts 13 studios where you can see the work of local artists, designers and creative companies. Great for inspiration and for coffee and cake.

Everything is close by in Portsmouth. One minute you could be on the deck of a historic ship, the next you could be walking down a bustling shopping street. The city is flat – perfect for walking and cycling.

You are never far from the beach in Portsmouth. And where there is a beach, you will find fish and chips and ice cream!

A spectacular range of events are planned every year in Portsmouth, on Southsea seafront and in the city's museums, galleries, theatres, live venues and parks.

Already at university?

Our Study Abroad programme offers you the opportunity to study for a half or full academic year and gain credits which you can transfer back to your home university. You will gain experience of a different academic environment and study in classes alongside full-time British and international students.

Study Abroad accommodation

Join us as a Study Abroad student at Portsmouth in the first term of the academic year and you can secure a guaranteed room in halls of residence. All you need to do is meet our accommodation and deposit deadlines.

If your Study Abroad programme starts in January, you can apply for accommodation during our autumn term. There is a good chance we can offer you a place in halls (depending on availability) but there is plenty of accommodation in the city – something suitable for all.

English language requirements and support

English language requirements

At the University, all our courses are delivered in English. To complete your course, you will need a sufficient level of English to take part in classes and discussions, and to produce assessed writing such as coursework and examinations.

You need to demonstrate your English language level by taking an approved English language test and sending us your results. Different courses need different levels of English, usually measured on the International English Language Test System (IELTS), though we also accept other tests. You will find a full list of acceptable English language qualifications at www.port.ac.uk/international/englishlanguage. You can see specific course requirements on the relevant course page at www.port.ac.uk.

Foundation courses

If you are interested in a Foundation or pathway course you need a minimum of IELTS band 5.5, with no component below 5.5.

Undergraduate courses

For most of our undergraduate courses, you need a minimum of IELTS band 6.0, with no component below 5.5. Some courses, especially those with a high level of discussion and writing, require higher scores. You can see course-specific details on the individual course webpages.

Postgraduate courses

For most of our Master's degrees, you need a minimum of IELTS band 6.5–7.0, with no component below 6.0. Some courses and PhDs require higher scores. You can see course-specific details on the individual course webpages.

PRE-SESSIONAL ENGLISH LANGUAGE COURSES

Whether you need to improve your English before starting your degree or just practise your language skills, apply for one of our Pre-Sessional English (PSE) language courses.

PSE programmes

You will get dedicated support and advice from experienced academic staff, International Student Advisers and Learning Development Tutors. You will study for 25 hours a week, Monday to Friday, in classes of no more than 14 and you will have the same tutor throughout your programme.

These courses are available to you if you:

- hold a conditional offer for one of our degree courses, but have not yet met the English language entry requirement
- have met the academic conditions and the English language entry requirement, but you want to do a refresher course in academic English

Need accommodation?

All pre-sessional students can book a room in our halls of residence during their programme. We offer private rooms with shared facilities, and free bedding and an equipment pack which is yours to keep. Fees apply.

Visas and immigration

YOU MAY NEED A STUDENT VISA TO STUDY IN THE UK. HERE ARE SOME OF THE MOST COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS, ALONG WITH LINKS TO OTHER PIECES OF HELPFUL INFORMATION.

WHAT TYPE OF VISA DO I NEED TO STUDY IN THE UK?

If you are a University of Portsmouth offer holder who is an EU, EEA or Swiss national and your course starts before 31 December 2020, you will not require a visa in order to study in the UK before this date. To check the latest information, visit the UK Visas and Immigration website www.gov.uk/tier-4-general-visa.

HOW CAN I APPLY FOR A STUDENT VISA?

Visit the UK Visas and Immigration website www.gov.uk/tier-4-general-visa/apply to apply for your visa. The earliest you can make a visa application is three months before your course starts.

I AM ALREADY IN THE UK, HOW CAN I GET A VISA?

If you are already in the UK and hold a student visa for a different institution, you will still need to apply for a new student visa. You will not be able to register onto your new course until you have applied for a new visa. EU STUDENT VISA REQUIREMENTS

We are firmly committed to the maintenance of a diverse and multicultural staff and student body and to the benefits of teaching, learning and research that our European collaborations bring. However the type of visa you will now require will depend on when you arrive in the UK.

If you are a University of Portsmouth offer holder from the EU, EEA or Switzerland and your course starts before 31 December 2020, you will not require a visa in order to study in the UK.

If your course starts after 1 January 2021, you will need to apply through the new immigration system currently under consideration in the UK.

Please check our website for the latest visa information for EU students.

DO I NEED TO PAY THE IMMIGRATION HEALTH SURCHARGE (IHS)?

You will need to pay this if you are applying to study in the UK for a period of more than six months. You will also need to pay the IHS if you are already in the UK and apply to extend your stay. The charge is per student and per dependent (should there be any) per year of study, payable at the time of visa application. If the surcharge is required, but not paid, the application will be refused or treated as invalid and will be rejected. COLLECTING YOUR BIOMETRIC RESIDENCE PERMIT (BRP)

When completing your visa application form, please state you wish to collect your visa from an alternative location. You will need to enter this code: **2HE479**. This will mean your BRP card will be available to collect during registration at the University.

WHAT IS A CAS AND HOW CAN I GET ONE? WHAT DO I NEED TO APPLY FOR A TIER 4 STUDENT VISA?

A CAS is a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies statement. Once you meet all your conditions (including your deposit) and accepted your unconditional offer, we will provide you with a CAS number for your visa application. As a sponsor, we are bound by law to abide by the regulations set out under the Tier 4 Sponsor Guidance. We may have to make checks on academic progression, length of time spent studying in the UK and financial capabilities of students prior to issuing a CAS.

Deadline for issuing Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS)

The CAS issuance deadline is early September 2021 (subject to change). If you apply close to the deadline date, the University may contact you to discuss your circumstances before making a final decision on whether it is appropriate to issue you with a CAS statement. You may be asked to provide evidence that you are able to arrange your visa application and arrive in good time.

WHAT DO I NEED TO APPLY FOR A TIER 4 STUDENT VISA?

If you will be joining us to study before 1 January 2021, you must meet the following criteria, which make up the 40 points required for a Tier 4 visa:

- A Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) from the University, plus your academic and English language evidence as confirmed on the CAS: 30 points.
- Evidence that you have funds to cover tuition fees for the first year of the course and to cover the required living costs (maintenance): 10 points. You would need to show this in your or your parents' bank account for 28 consecutive days before you make your visa application. If you are in receipt of Official Financial Sponsorship you will need to show evidence of this in an original letter.

The University of Portsmouth is on the UK government's Register of Education and Training Providers, and on the UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) Register of Sponsors Licensed under the Points Based System. Our Sponsor Licence Number (SLN) on this register is **926WMQ73**. This number is needed to support a visa application.

Your application also requires our Department of Student and Academic Administration address, which is: MyPort Information Hub, c/o Tier 4 Compliance, University of Portsmouth, Nuffield Centre, St Michael's Road, Portsmouth, PO1 2ED.

Privately rented shared houses/flats

Many students prefer to live independently in the city or surrounding area. Students can expect to pay around around £80–£100 per week in a shared flat or house excluding household bills, budgeting for an additional £25–£40 per week for food and household bills. Some landlords will offer rent including household bills which is usually between £90–£120 per week. Remember, students will still need to budget for food costs if the rent includes bills. SCHOLARSHIPS

Vice-Chancellor's Global Development Scholarship

Eligible students will be able to receive the Vice-Chancellor's Global Development Scholarship. This scholarship will take the form of a £1,600 fee reduction that will apply to your first year of study.

Chancellor's Global Academic Merit Scholarship

For September 2020 entry onwards, students may be eligible to receive the Chancellor's Global Academic Merit Scholarship. This scholarship will take the form of a £5,000 fee reduction that will apply to your first year of study. This scholarship is merit based so students would need to have met all their offer conditions by 1 June 2021.

FEE PAYMENT

Fees can be paid in full at registration or in two instalments of 50 per cent shortly after the course start date and then again at the start of your second term.

If you pay two years' fees (or more) in advance (or during the first week of your course), you can pay a fixed entry fee for those years and avoid the small annual increase in tuition fees. Fees must be paid in full and will be fixed at the rate of your year of entry.

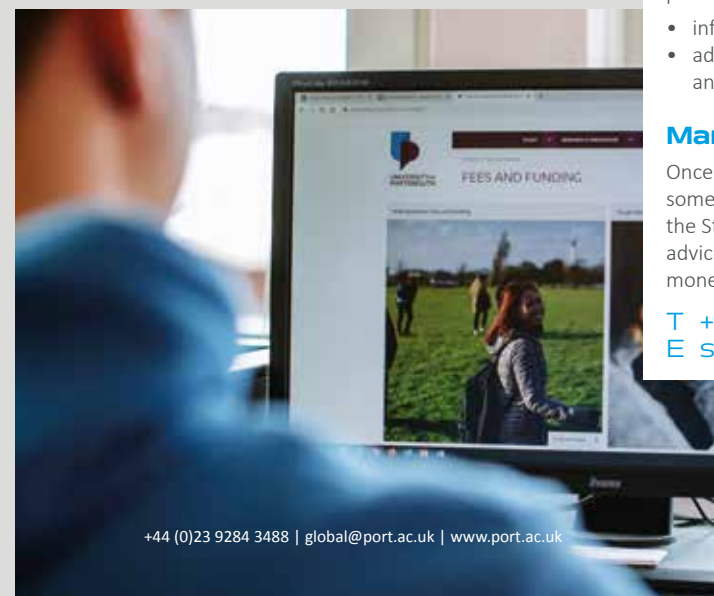

RESEARCH THAT MAKES A DIFFERENCE.

We are a globally responsible organisation, dedicated to identifying and solving problems, enriching people's lives and bringing about lasting change. We place a huge value on research and innovation that create solutions for the real world, tackling problems that impact society, human life and our planet. All of this offers you outstanding opportunities to learn from staff at the forefront of their disciplines.

Solving the plastic problem

Plastic pollution is reaching crisis level. Around one million plastic bottles are sold every minute across the globe – and only 14 per cent are recycled¹. Un-recycled plastics end up in our seas, contaminating marine ecosystems and harming oceanic life. At Portsmouth, we are working on a new solution for recycling common plastics. An international team of researchers, jointly led by the University of Portsmouth's Professor John McGeehan and including Alumni PhD student Harry Austin, engineered a mutant enzyme that digests PET plastic (commonly used in drinks bottles) and returns it to its original building blocks². The enzyme takes just days to start breaking down PET, compared to the 450 years this would take in the ocean – and the researchers think they can make this process even faster. At our new Centre for Enzyme Innovation, they are working to improve the enzyme for industrial use, opening the door to a circular recycling solution for the world's plastic waste.

Tackling taboos so women can beat cancer

For Judith Fletcher-Brown, overcoming breast cancer began a journey of discovery. On her celebratory holiday in India, Judith learned the country has the fastest-growing incidence rate of breast cancer in the world. Even worse, half of those who develop the disease die from it. Cultural taboo means many women do not know how to self examine or even what to look for. Now Judith is leading the development of a new strategy to make breast examination normal in India. In collaboration with her University of Portsmouth colleague Diane Carter, Judith hopes to pack tablet computers full of information about cancer, self examination and treatment. Making the most of creative technology, this will be an engaging, interactive way for community nurses to educate and save lives.

To protect the planet, we must find ways of making transport more sustainable. Professor Hom Nath Dhakal wants to help the transport industry on this journey. As the leader of the University of Portsmouth's Advanced Materials and Manufacturing Research Group, he's driving pioneering work to enable a manufacturing revolution – the production of composite vehicle parts using sustainable, organic, biodegradable materials. His world-leading team aim to prove how natural fibres like flax, and waste by-products from agriculture, can compete with man-made materials like carbon fibres and glass fibres in terms of strength and endurance while weighing less and being more energy-efficient to produce.

Our 26-seat laboratory is used by students on our Dental Hygiene and Dental Therapy courses to develop their pre-clinical skills. Skills developed are periodontal, restorative and paediatric dentistry. Each station is equipped with a dental handpiece, suction, overhead dental lamp and computer monitor.

Motion capture studios

We have multiple motion capture studios, including one that uses a Vicon optical system to deliver a professional experience of motion capture to our students and staff. STEP 1 Choose the right course

STEP 2 Apply early

You can apply directly to the University for all our courses. If you want to apply for undergraduate courses at more than one university in the UK, you should apply through UCAS instead. Alternatively you can apply in your country through one of our local offices or through our representatives.

- Prepare your personal statement – visit www.port.ac.uk and search for 'personal statement guidance'
- Choose how you would like to apply and start your application process. If you are applying directly to the University of Portsmouth you need to apply through the course webpage
- Complete your application and submit it online. You do not need to wait for all your documents to be available to apply – you can supply these as soon as you have them. Many creative courses require the review of a relevant portfolio – visit www.port.ac.uk/ci/portfolio-guides.

STEP 3 Accepting your place

If you're successful, we will send you an offer of a place at the University. If this is 'conditional', it means there is at least one requirement you need to meet before you can be sure of a place on the course. The most common examples of conditions for international students are English language, providing qualification documents and/or making a deposit.

As soon as you get your offer, review it and accept it via the Applicant View. Accepting your offer means that you have reserved a place on the course. It does not mean that the place is guaranteed; you still need to meet your conditions (see step 4 for all students and step 6 for students who will require a visa for study in the UK).

STEP 6

Deposit payments and visa requirements

International students: The conditions of your offer will include making your deposit payment and completing your visa requirements.

When you have done this and we have received your payment and all your supporting documentation (see step 4), we will make your offer unconditional, which means you have a confirmed place on the course. We cannot give you a CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies) statement which allows you to apply for your visa until you have met all of your conditions (this may include an ATAS certificate for certain courses).

- When you log into Applicant View, you can go to 'My Finances' and follow the guidance to make a payment or upload a sponsor letter

STEP 7

Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) statement

International Students: Three months before the start of your course we begin to send out CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies) statements. The CAS allows you to apply for your visa. So, in most cases this will be from July onwards. If your course starts in January, it will be from October onwards. We can only send the CAS when your offer is unconditional and you have accepted it so check steps 3, 4 and 6 again to make sure you have sent us everything we have asked for and have accepted your offer.

- Check that the status of your offer says 'unconditional' on your University of Portsmouth Applicant View or UCAS website and accept your offer if you have not done so already
- Check your emails regularly for your CAS statement (if you are applying through an agent this will be sent to both you and your agent)
- Apply for a visa. There is lots of advice at www.port.ac.uk/study/international-students/visa-advice. When you receive your CAS check to ensure that the data is correct. If you need any amendments made, please email cascorrections@port.ac.uk to have this updated before applying for your visa. Apply for your student visa once you are happy your CAS statement is correct. You can apply for your visa up to three months before the start of your course. If you need visa advice email global@port.ac.uk
- Please note visa rules may change for international students from 1 January 2021

STEP 8

Plan your journey to Portsmouth

It's really important that you arrive in time to enjoy the Orientation Programme and attend your course induction before your course starts. For most students this is in September. For students on January-start courses the course induction will take place in January.

- Some courses may require a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check, and/or occupational health screening. Please check with the department if an approved alternative is accepted.
- Also note that some of our courses are only offered to practising UK professionals and, where this is the case, it will be indicated on the course page.
- Please check the website for details of entry requirements for individual courses.
- Some courses may require an ATAS (Academic Technology Approval Scheme) certificate – this will be stated in the conditions of your offer.
- Some of our courses require an interview. These can be conducted online where you are unable to attend in person.

Entry requirements

General entry requirements

We will normally expect you to have the equivalent of two to three A levels in appropriate subjects. Please check the course pages on our website for specific entry requirements. We also normally require a minimum of three GCSE passes or equivalent in subjects other than those offered at A level. GCSE passes relate to grades C/4 and above. GCSE English and mathematics are also normally required.

English language requirements

If your first language is not English, the minimum English language proficiency level for undergraduates is IELTS band 6.0 overall with no component score below 5.5, to band 6.5 overall with no component score below 6.0 or equivalent, or GCSE/IGCSE English Language minimum grade C/4. For most of our Master's degrees, you need a minimum of IELTS band 6.5–7.0, with no component below 6.0. Some courses and PhDs require higher scores.

Please note, the UK Visas and Immigration Office is considering a change to English language requirements for visa applications, so there may be changes to our requirements, after this guide is published. We normally expect you to achieve any conditions of an offer by no later than 31 August in the year of entry.

- Direct applications for undergraduate and postgraduate courses are considered all year round – but certain courses will have application deadlines to adhere to. Please contact international.admissions@port.ac.uk for course-specific deadlines
- University Pre-Sessional English courses – deadlines for applications to these courses are typically two weeks before the start of the course

We advise you to apply as early as possible in order to have sufficient time to apply for a student visa.

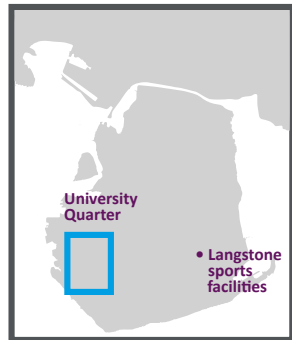
