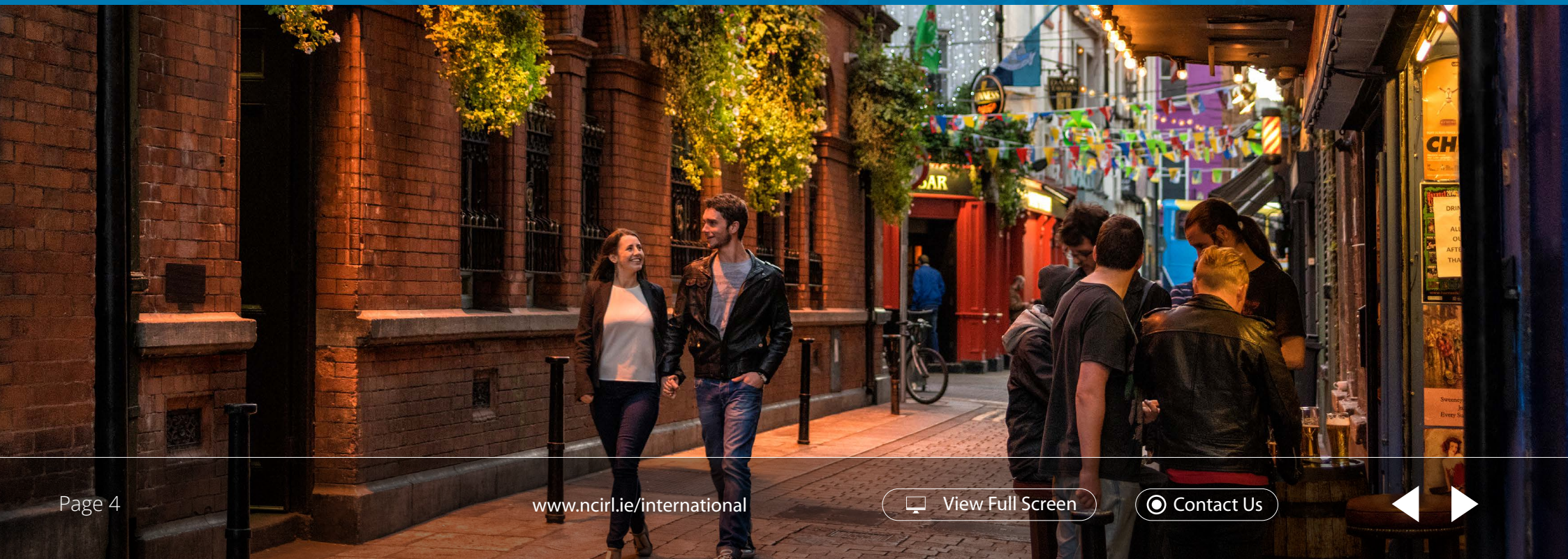

Silicon Docks

Silicon Docks is the name given to the Grand Canal area, just five minutes walk from NCI's campus. This area is now home to some of the world's biggest and newest tech companies and their 40,000 staff. IFSC
