

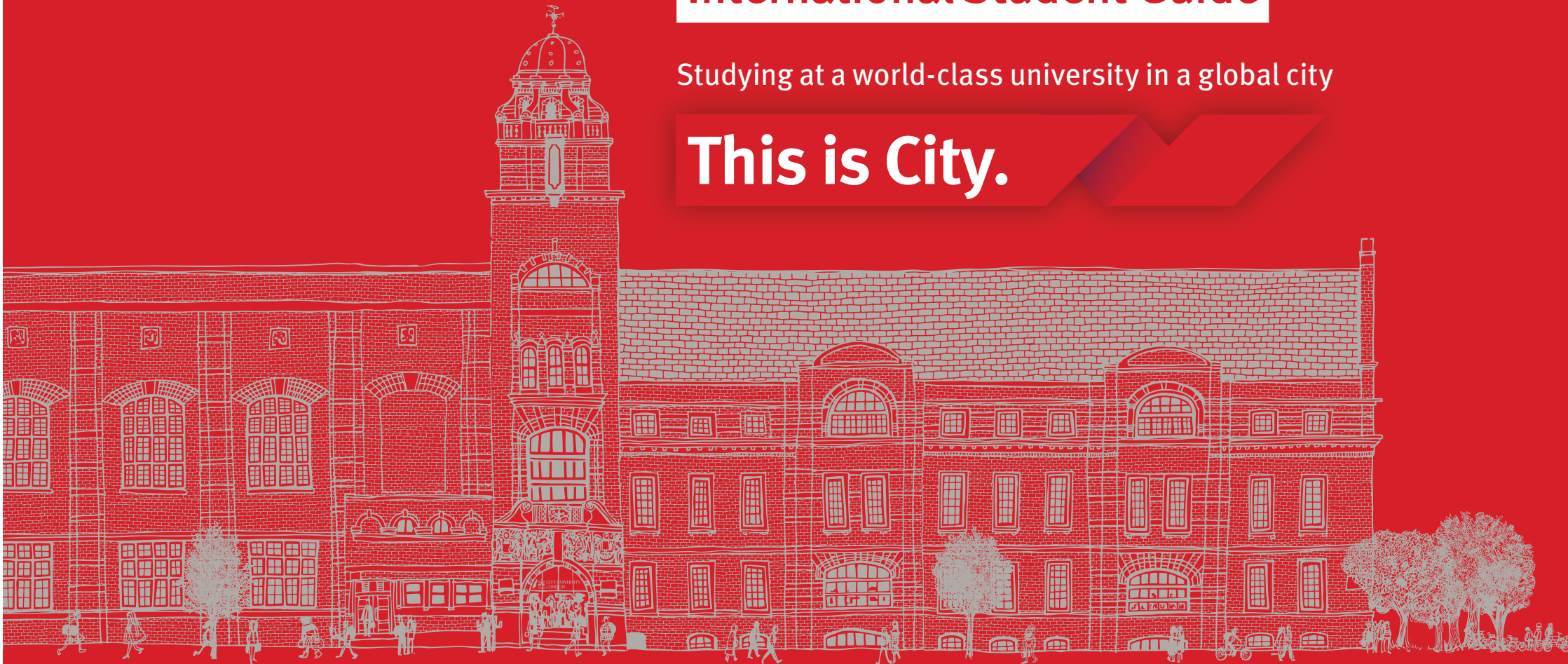

City, University of London is a special place. Our unique focus on academic excellence for business and the professions contributes to make us a leading global university.


Since our foundation in 1894, our academics and students have used education, research and enterprise to transform their lives, their communities and the world.

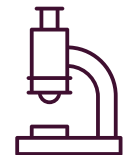

Thanks to City’s commitment to sustainability, I have a new-found appreciation for bees and the need to protect our environment.”



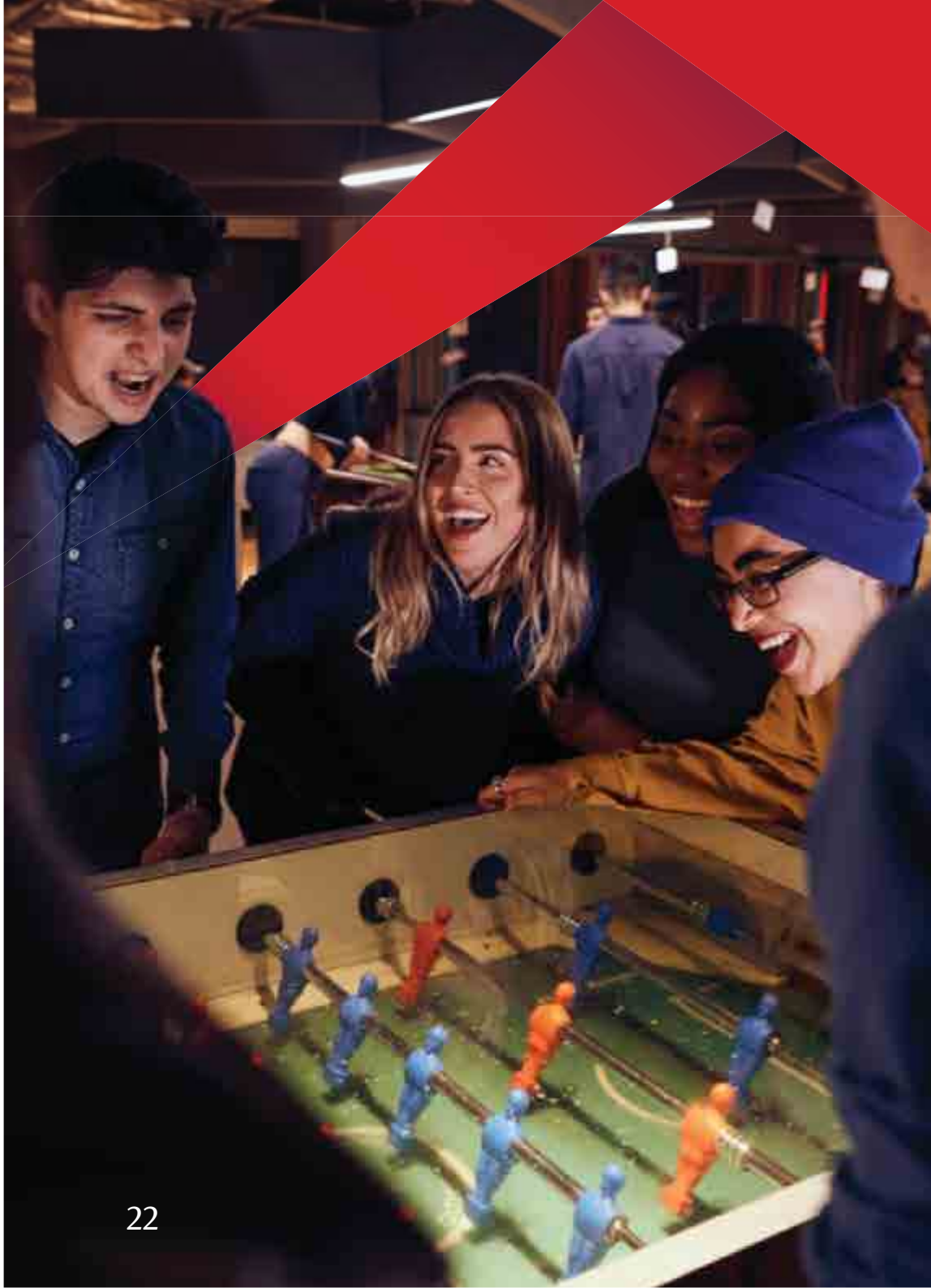

# Accommodation



Whether you choose to live in halls or privately rented housing, City offers a variety of accommodation options and support services to help you settle in London.

Moving to a big city may seem intimidating, but it is much easier if you have arranged somewhere to live that is comfortable and close to other students.

### Halls of residence

With dedicated halls for both undergraduate and postgraduate students, there is a range of choices available from self-contained studio flats to options with shared kitchens and/or bathrooms. You can expect to pay between £160 and £300 per week.

All prospective full-time students can apply for a place in halls of residence and we offer a Guarantee Scheme for all first-year undergraduates who firmly accept a place at City before the accommodation deadline (end of June).

### Private accommodation

There are many private providers of student accommodation in London, several of which are also located very close to the main campus. You can also consider to rent a flat or a shared house privately.

# How to apply

## Undergraduate

All applications for undergraduate courses must be made through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS).

Applications for September 2021 entry are open between 8<sup>th</sup> September 2020 and 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021. Late applications (after 15<sup>th</sup> January) will be considered subject to availability of places on City courses until UCAS' final deadline on 30<sup>th</sup> June 2021. After this date, any application will be automatically entered into Clearing, opening on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2021. This is the process that allows you to apply for any remaining places on our courses to start studying at City in September.

We strongly recommend you to apply as early as possible, ideally by the 15<sup>th</sup> January deadline, as popular courses may fill early.

## Postgraduate

Applications for the majority of postgraduate courses should be made directly to City, University of London.

To apply, please visit the webpage of your intended course of study and click on the 'How to apply' tab to read more about the application process (including any supporting documentation required) and access our online application system.

With few exceptions, many courses do not have a fixed deadline for application and operate on a rolling admission basis. Early applications are recommended as competition for places is strong and applications close when the course is full.

## Undergraduate

If your home country qualification does not qualify for direct entry, you can undertake a foundation course that will prepare you to study at City (see overleaf).

## Postgraduate

A UK second-class honours degree (or international equivalent) is generally the minimum requirement for entry onto postgraduate courses. For some degrees, professional qualifications and employment experience may be required, but also may be considered alongside or instead of an undergraduate degree.

# International pathway courses

International pathway courses are designed for overseas students whose academic qualifications are not accepted for direct entry into City.

These pathways aim to prepare students for degree-level study and if you choose one of our partner providers, completion of these courses guarantees entry into City degrees, subject to you meeting grade requirements.

Our partner colleges and centres are close to the campus and while studying on these courses, you will have access to a range of student services and facilities at City.

### **INTO City, University of London**

INTO City is a joint venture between the University and INTO University Partnerships. Established in 2009, INTO City delivers International Foundation and Graduate Diploma programmes for overseas students seeking entry onto City bachelor's and master's degrees, respectively. INTO City courses are validated by the University, which provides assurance of the quality and standards of education.

# English language requirements



If English is not your first language, you will be required to demonstrate that your English ability is sufficient to undertake degree-level study.

English language requirements vary by degree and details can be found on course webpages.

If you require a visa to study in the UK, you will also need to provide evidence of your English ability to UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI). This may be through a recognised Secure English Language Test (SELT) such as IELTS or – for postgraduate students – through evidence of completion of an academic qualification equivalent to a UK degree from a majority English-speaking country (as defined by the UKVI).

## Pre-sessional English courses

If you do not meet the English language requirements for your course, you may enrol on one of the pre-sessional English language courses, delivered by INTO City.

Pre-sessional courses are available as 4, 8 and 12-week programmes and run from late June to early September, depending on language level and degree requirements. Towards the end of your course, you will be formally assessed by INTO City and you will need to achieve the specified score in your offer in order to progress onto your intended course.

# Visa requirements

If you are planning to study a full-time course for six months or more at City, you will need to apply for a student visa\*. This also includes EU, EEA and Swiss citizens arriving in the UK from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2021.

Applying for a student visa should be fairly straightforward as long as you prepare well in advance by researching the requirements for students from your country. You can read more about visa requirements on our website.

## Graduate Immigration Route

A new post-study work visa enables international students to remain in the UK for two years after they have completed their studies. International students who successfully complete a degree course at City in the summer of 2021 or after then, and who hold a valid and existing Tier 4 visa at the time of application are eligible. Successful applicants will be able to work, or look for work in any sector, at any level and will be able to switch into skilled work once they find a suitable job and meet the requirements.

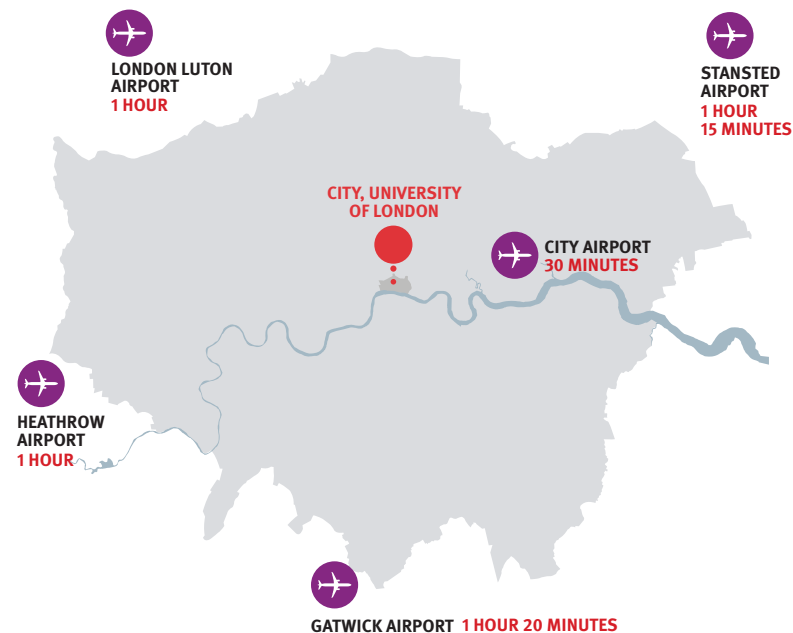

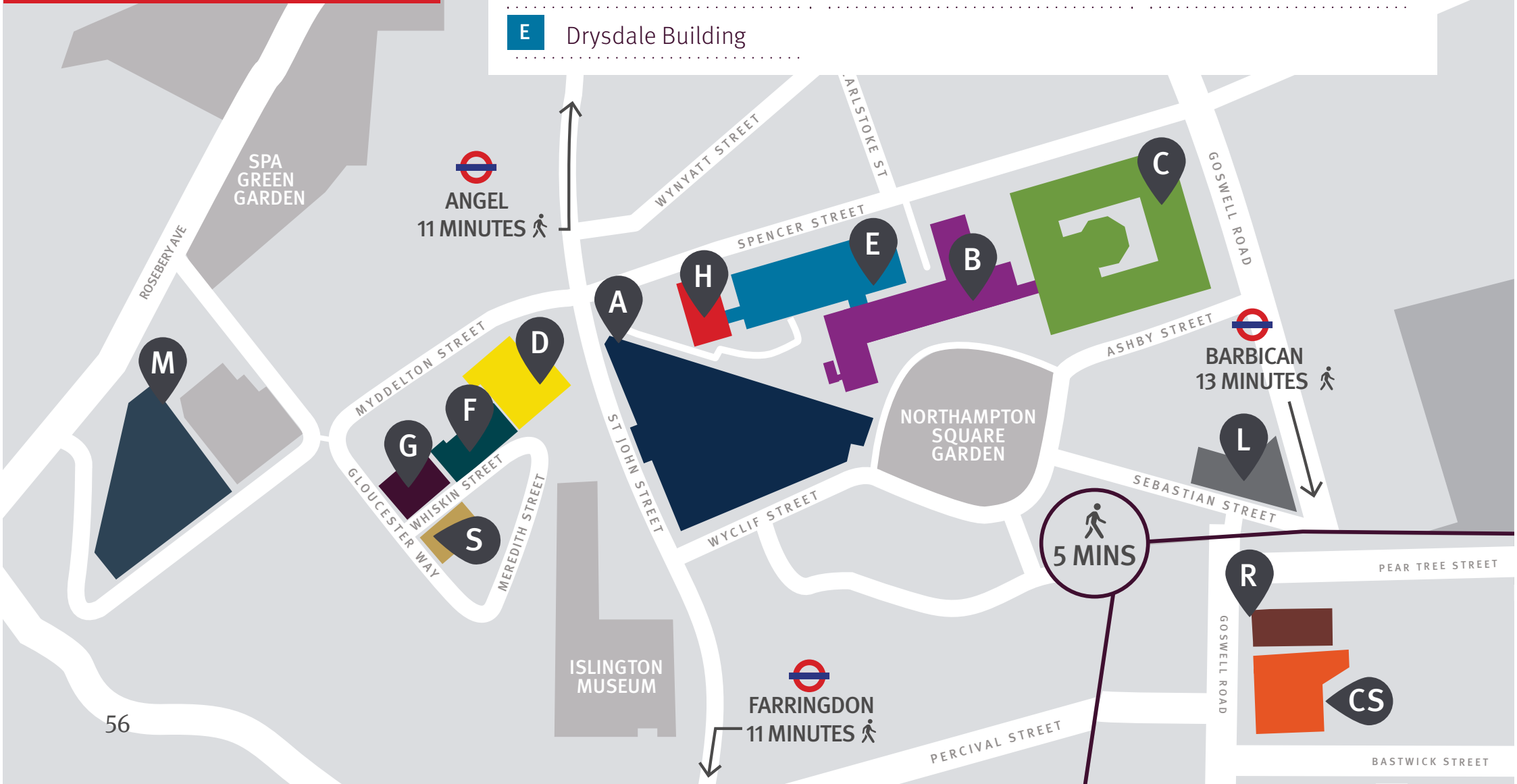
