

BUDGET TO PLAN FOR

Departure expenses (approx. €3,000)

- Student visa: approx. €20-€150 (fees according to country can be found on this website: france-visas.gouv.fr)
- Plane ticket to France: €1.000-€1.800
- Security deposit to reserve accommodations: €200-€600
- Pocket money for arrival in France: €1,000 min.

Monthly expenses (€500-€1,200)

- Rent: €300-€750
- Bills (Internet, telephone, utilities, etc.): €50-€150
- Public transportation: €27.60-€51
- Food: €200-€300
